Tack Sale

The WC4-HHA hosted Wisconsin's largest 4-H tack sale fundraiser on Sunday, February 11th. The tack sale hosted more than150 vendors that came to sell new and pre-owned horse tack, show clothing, western wear, and stable supplies at the Waukesha Expo facility. After expenses, the funds raised are used to help support educational opportunities and offset show expenses related to the Waukesha County 4-H horse and pony project. The 4-H Youth Board had their own table of donated items and also hosted a bake sale table.

The weather was favorable, and the tack sale once again sold out of all vendor spaces. Shoppers were lined up at the door at 9am! Reporter Spencer Tracy from Fox News 6 attended the tack sale and not only facilitated four live cut ins during the Fox 6 Morning Show, but also submitted a special

interest story of the tack sale for the evening news on the day of the Superbowl.



Horses are measured at the withers in units called hands. A hand is 4 inches, the width of average hand.


The Coggins test is required for any horse leaving its property. It is a blood test to check for Equine Infectious Anemia, a viral disease in horses transmitted by mosquitoes.
